Section 1. The San Francisco Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code is hereby amended by amending Sections 3.102.5, 3.1-105, 3.1-120, 3.1-145, 3.1-150, 3.1-155, 3.1-160, 3.1-175, 3.1-195, 3.1-205, 3.1-207, 3.1-218, 3.1-230, 3.1-242, 3.1-245, 3.1-252, 3.1-265, 3.1-267, 3.1-270, 3.1-275, 3.1-285, 3.1-312, 3.1-315, 3.1-320, 3.1-325, 3.1-335, 3.1-340, 3.1-345, 3.1-350, 3.1-365, 3.1-375, 3.1-390, 3.1-395, 3.1-420, 3.1-435, 3.1-440, 3.1-445, and 3.1-500, to read as follows:

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

- (a) Subject to the removal and Civil Service provisions of the Charter as well as any applicable Civil Service Rules, any officer or employee of the City and County of San Francisco who fails to file any statement required by Sections 3.1-101 and 3.1-102 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code within 30 days after receiving notice from the Ethics Commission of a failure to file may be subject to disciplinary action by his or her appointing authority, including removal from office or termination of employment.
- (b) The Ethics Commission may issue a letter to an appointing authority recommending removal of any City officer or termination of any City employee who has failed to file a statement required by Sections 3.1-101 and 3.1-102 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code if the City officer or employee has not filed the required statement within 30 days of receiving notice from the Ethics Commission of his or her failure to file.
- (c) Every appointing authority whose appointees file statements required by Sections 3.1-101 and 3.1-102 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code with the Ethics Commission shall provide written notice to the Ethics Commission of the name of any appointee who has assumed or left office or employment. Such notice shall be provided within 15 days of the City officer or employee assuming or leaving office or employment. Failure to provide such notice may constitute official misconduct.

SEC. 3.1-105. NOTICE OF APPOINTMENT AND RESIGNATION.

(a) Every appointing authority whose appointees file statements required by Sections 3.1-101 and 3.1-102 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code with the Ethics Commission shall provide written notice to the Ethics Commission of the name of any appointee who has assumed or left office or employment. Such notice shall be provided within 15 days of the City officer or employee

assuming or leaving office or employment. Failure to provide such notice may constitute official misconduct.

(b) Whenever the Mayor or a board or commission appoints a department head, or receives the resignation or retirement notice of a department head, the official or the secretary to the board or commission who makes the appointment or receives the resignation or retirement notice, shall promptly inform the Ethics Commission. The official or secretary shall also inform the department head of the necessity to file within 30 days onof assuming office or leaving office a statement of economic interests. Upon receiving notice of the appointment, or the resignation or retirement, of the department head, the Ethics Commission shall perform the required duties of the filing officer and obtain the required statement of economic interests.

SEC. 3.1-120. AIRPORT COMMISSION.

- (a) **Disclosure Category 2.** Persons in this category shall disclose all investments and business positions in business entities and income from any source which provides, or contracts with the City and County of San Francisco and its Airports Commission to provide, services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment to the Airports Commission.

SEC. 3.1-395. REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY.

- (a) **Disclosure Category 2.** Persons in this category shall disclose all sources of income, investments, and all business positions in which the <u>person in such designated position</u> <u>designated employee</u> is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or holds any position of management.
- (b) **Disclosure Category 3.** Persons in this category shall disclose all income from and investments in businesses that manufacture or sell supplies of the type utilized by the Agency.

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"Consultant" means any natural person who provides, under contract, information, advice, recommendation or counsel to the Agency, provided, however, that "consultant" shall not include a person who:

(A)—Conducts research and arrives at conclusions with respect to his or her rendition of information, advice, recommendation or counsel independent of the control and direction of the Agency or of any Agency official, other than normal contract monitoring; and

(B) Possesses no authority with respect to any Agency decision beyond the rendition of information, advice, recommendation or counsel.

- (A) Within the boundaries of the District; or
- (B) Within two miles of the boundaries of the District, including any leasehold, beneficial or ownership interest or option to acquire such interest in real property, if the fair market value of the interest is greater than \$1,000.

Interests in real property of an individual include a business entity's share of interest in real property of any business entity or trust in which the designated employee or his or her spouse owns directly, indirectly or beneficially, a 10 percent interest or greater.

- (2) Investments in or income from business entities which are contractors or subcontractors which are or have been within the previous two-year period engaged in the performances of building construction or design within the District.
- (3)—Investments in or income from business entities engaged in the acquisition or disposal of real property within the jurisdiction.

Investment includes any financial interest a pro rata share of investments of any business entity or trust in which the designated employee or his or her spouse owns, directly, indirectly or beneficially, a 10 percent interest or greater.

Investment does not include a time or demand deposit in a financial institution, shares in a credit union, any insurance policy or any bond or other debt instrument issued by any government or government agency. No investment or interest in real property is reportable unless its fair market value exceeds \$1,000. No source of income is reportable unless the income received by or promised to the public official aggregates \$250 in value during the preceding 12-month reporting period.

(<u>a</u>b) Disclosure Category 2. <u>Supplies and Equipment. Persons in this eategory shall</u> disclose investments in or income from business entities which manufacture or sell supplies, books, machinery or equipment of the type utilized by the department for which the designated employee is

manager or director. Investments include interests described in Category 1. Persons in this category shall disclose income, investments, and all business positions in any business entity which does business in this jurisdiction.

- (be) Disclosure Category 3. Work or Services. Persons in this category shall disclose investments in or income from business entities which are contractors or subcontractors engaged in the performance of work services of the type utilized by the department for which the designated employee is manager or director. Investments include the interests described in Category 1. Persons in this category shall disclose all interests in real property, and all income from and investments in business entities which hold interests in real property in this jurisdiction, and all business positions held in such business entities.
- (c) Disclosure Category 3. Persons in this category shall disclose all interests in real property, and all income from and investments in business entities which hold interests in real property in this jurisdiction, and all business positions held in such business entities.
- (d) Disclosure Category 4. Services and Equipment. Persons in this category shall disclose income, investments and business positions in (1) business entities that manufacture or sell supplies, books, machinery or equipment of the type utilized or purchased by the department for which the designated employee is manager or director; or (2) business entities that are contractors or subcontractors engaged in the performance of work services of the type utilized or purchased by the department for which the designated employee is manager or director.
