WHEREAS, Stopping the hate begins with recognizing the problem, and joining together in a shared effort that responds to and prevents such acts of hatred; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco "Working to Stop Hate Violence" highlights the activities and actions of many different organization working together to create alternatives to
