URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO SUPPORT H.R. 3632, A BILL REVISING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE GOLDEN GATE NATIONAL RECREATION AREA TO INCLUDE 1.4 ACRES OF THE AREA KNOWN AS PARCEL 4.

WHEREAS, In the 1978 Parks Bill political maneuverings led to the inclusion of a clause prohibiting the National Parks Service from obtaining more than 1.9 acres of the 3.3 acre tract of land referred to as Parcel Four, bordered by the Great Highway, Balboa, and Sutro Park; and,

WHEREAS, In 1993, The City and County of San Francisco acquired the land known as Parcel Four in order to preserve this area as open space; and,

WHEREAS, This public acquisition was the culmination of 25 years of citizen effort after closing Playland-at-the-Beach involving many political leaders and community organizations; and,

5 WHEREAS, Historically, this land has been devoted to recreation, strategically linking
6 Ocean Beach and Sutro Park, and is currently a prominent corner in a major visitor area
7 linking other developed coastal parklands, notably Golden Gate Park and the Golden Gate
8 National Recreation Area; and,

WHEREAS, In 1996, the Recreation and Park and Public Works Departments
conducted an extensive planning process involving community members and landscape
architects resulting in a simple, naturalistic Conceptual Plan approved by the Recreation and
Park Commission in January, 1997; and,

WHEREAS, the City has expressed its desire to turn over this land to the Golden Gate National Recreation Area which has, in turn, declared its willingness to take over maintenance of this site after the landscape is developed; and,

WHEREAS, While the City has successfully acquired funding for the clean-up and restoration of Parcel Four, including a grant from the California Coastal Conservancy, the existing clause in the Parks Bill severely limits the ability of GGNRA to maintain this property in the long term; and,

WHEREAS, Congressmembers Nancy Pelosi, Tom Lantos and Lynn Wolsey introduced H.R. 3632, expanding the boundaries of the Golden Gate National Recreation Area including the remaining 1.4 acres of Parcel Four; and,

8 WHEREAS, This Bill would clear the final hurdle to restoring this unused and unsightly 9 piece of land and reestablish continuity in San Francisco's coastline recreation area; now, 10 therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
 does hereby urge the United States Congress to support H.R. 3632, a bill revising the Golden
 Gate National Recreation Area boundaries to include 1.4 acres of the area known as Parcel
 Four.
