RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE WHITE HOUSE INITIATIVE TO INCREASE PUBLIC
AWARENESS OF THE INCARCERATION OF 120,000 AMERICANS OF JAPANESE
ANCESTRY AND TO PRESERVE THE INTERNMENT CAMPS OF WORLD WAR II

WHEREAS, On February 19, 1942, President Frankiln D. Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066, pursuant to which 120,000 Americans and resident aliens of Japanese ancestry, many of whom were California citizens, were incarcerated in internment camps during World War II; and

WHEREAS, These 120,000 citizens experienced a great human cost of abandoned homes, businesses, careers, education, professional advancement and disruption of culture and family; and

WHEREAS, On August 10, 1988, President Ronald Reagan signed into law the Civil Liberties Act of 1988 finding that Executive Order 9066 was not justified by military necessity, hence caused by racial prejudice, was hysteria, and a failure of political leadership; and

WHEREAS, The Civil Liberties Act of 1988 committed to increasing public awareness of this grave mistake by the federal government so that future generations will not experience the failure of political leadership in times of adversity; and

WHEREAS, The White House Administration is proposing a \$4.8 million in the Federal Year 2001 Budget to construct a new visitor center at the Manzanar National Historic Site in California, to acquire and preserve other former internment camp locations in Wyoming, Utah, Idaho, and Arkansas, and begin a National Park Service study of other locations that have historical significance, including the internment camp site at Tule Lake, California; and

WHEREAS, This national investment will serve as a permanent reminder and living education centers of Executive Order 9066, a policy of grave injustice against American citizens and resident aliens of Japanese ancestry, without review or evidence against them,

and will educate Americans and other visitors on this dark chapter in our nation's history so that this civil wrong will never occur again; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco supports this investment of the Federal Year 2001 Budget to educate Americans of this grave injustice on our Nations history; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board transmit a copy of this resolution to the President of the United States and to the chairs of the Appropriations Committees of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives.
