AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, POPULATION HEALTH AND PREVENTION, COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES, TO ENTER INTO A SUBCONTRACT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,285.31 WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (SAN FRANCISCO), THE PRIMARY CONTRACTOR, TO PROVIDE DATA AND CONSULTATION FOR A STUDY OF THE CONSEQUENCES OF COMORBID DRUG ABUSE AND MENTAL DISORDERS, WHICH INCLUDES A RIGHTS IN DATA CLAUSE AND DOES NOT INCLUDE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY INDEMNIFICATION AND FALSE CLAIMS CLAUSES; RETROACTIVE TO SEPTEMBER 1, 1999.

WHEREAS, The University of California (San Francisco) has received funds from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) for a project entitled "Consequences of Comorbid Drug Abuse and Mental Disorders"; and,

WHEREAS, The University of California (San Francisco) as the primary contractor, has requested that the Department of Public Health, Community Mental Health Services, enter into a subcontract to participate in this project; and,

WHEREAS, The University of California (San Francisco) has agreed to reimburse the Department of Public Health, Community Mental Health Services in the amount of \$3,285.31 under the terms of this subcontract; and

WHEREAS, The subcontract specifies that the Department of Public Health is to provide data and consultation deemed necessary to meet the reporting requirements of the DHHS Granting Agency during the term of the subcontract; and

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds, University of California (San Francisco) requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. <u>000776</u>; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement contains a certain provision described below, which requires the approval of the Board of Supervisors; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement does not contain certain provisions described below, which are required under the Administrative Code unless waived by the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, The grant budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$156.44; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health is hereby authorized to enter into a subcontract in the amount of \$3,285.31 with the University of California (San Francisco), the primary contractor, for provision of data and consultation during the period covered by this Agreement; retroactive to September 1, 1999; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the provision in the Agreement pursuant to which the City agrees to grant a royalty-free, nonexclusive, and irrevocable license for the use of data developed under the subcontract; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Section 21.21 of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include an indemnification of the City by the University of California for the infringement of patent rights, copyright, trademark, and other intellectual property rights; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement that the Agreement include a paragraph reciting the false claim provisions contained in Section 21.35 of the Administrative Code; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Health to enter into similar agreements with the University of California (San Francisco) if the subcontract recurs or is renewed.
