

1 [CONTRACTING OUT SECURITY SERVICES]
2 CONCURRING WITH THE CONTROLLER'S DETERMINATION THAT SECURITY SERVICES
3 CAN BE PRACTICALLY PERFORMED AT THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES BY
4 PRIVATE CONTRACTOR FOR A LOWER COST THAN SIMILAR WORK SERVICES
5 PERFORMED BY CITY AND COUNTY EMPLOYEES.

6 WHEREAS, The Department of Human Services has had privately provided
7 security services since 1976; and

8 WHEREAS, The electorate of the City and County of San Francisco passed
9 Proposition J in November 1976 adding section 8.300-1 to the Charter
10 allowing City Departments to contract with private companies for services
11 which can be practically performed for a lower cost than similar services
12 performed by employees of the City and County; and

13 WHEREAS, The Controller determined on April 28, 2000, that said
14 services can be performed at lower cost by a private contractor to the
15 Department of Human Services than by employees of the City and County;
16 now, therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby concurs with the
18 Controller's determination and approves that the Department of Human Services
19 may contract for security services.


