WHEREAS, The Child Support Reform legislation requires the City and County of San
Francisco to create a Department of Child Support Services separate and apart from the
District Attorney’s Office; and,

WHEREAS, The Child Support Reform legislation further empowers the Board of
Supervisors to appoint a Director the Department of Child Support Services; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Child Support Services will be created as of July 1,
2000 and the functions, organization and personnel from the current Family Support Bureau
of the District Attorney will become the Department of Child Support Services; now, therefore,
be it

RESOLVED, That The Board of Supervisors recognizes the need for a interim Director
who can facilitate a smooth transition from the District Attorney’s Office – Family Support
Bureau to the Department of Child Support Services; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby appoints Milton Hyams,
acting Director of the Family Support Bureau as the acting Director of the Department of Child
Support Services.
