AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND TRAFFIC TO RETROACTIVELY APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,387,000 IN STIP FUNDS FOR VARIOUS TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, SB 45 (Chapter 622, Statutes 1997) substantially revised the process for estimating the amount of state and federal funds available for transportation projects in the state for appropriating and allocating the available funds to these projects; and,

WHEREAS, As part of that new process, the Metropolitan

Transportation Commission (MTC) is responsible for programming

projects eligible for State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)

funds, pursuant to Government Code Section 14527(b), for inclusion in

the State Transportation Improvement Program, and submission to the

California Transportation Commission, for inclusion in the State

Transportation Improvement Program; and,

WHEREAS, MTC has requested eligible transportation project sponsors to submit applications nominating projects to be programmed for STIP funds in the 2000 State Transportation Improvement Program; and,

WHEREAS, In January 2000 the San Francisco County Transportation Authority adopted the San Francisco Corridor Management Program that included the projects listed below; and

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WHEREAS, The Department of Parking and Traffic is requesting a STIP grant totaling \$900,000 to design, purchase, and install the Third Street Integrated Traffic Management System; and,

WHEREAS, The Department of Parking and Traffic is requesting a STIP grant totaling \$487,000 to install various pedestrian crossing protection improvements including installing signs and signal equipment, lighted crosswalks, and pedestrian signal countdown devices at pedestrian and bicycle crossings at various locations; and,

WHEREAS, The Parking and Traffic Commission approved Resolution No. 109-00-PTC, authorizing the Executive Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic to execute documents necessary to apply for, accept, and expend \$2,895,000 of federal funds to implement five safety projects, including the two aforementioned projects; and,

WHEREAS, Indirect costs are ineligible according to State of California rules and regulations; and,

WHEREAS, There are no required local matching funds under the STIP, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby authorize the Executive Director of Parking and Traffic to retroactively apply for, accept and expend \$1,387,000 in State Transportation Improvement Program funds for the aforementioned traffic projects and to execute any and all documents necessary therefor.
