(SAN FRANCISCO SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM)

AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO RETROACTIVELY, "ACCEPT AND EXPEND" A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000) FROM THE CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPLEMENTING THE MODEL SCHOOL PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Recycling Program will implement a model school program with the assistance of IWMB funding in the amount of \$50,000.

Schools generate a virtually untapped source of organic and other materials that can be recycled. These institutions engage in procurement, materials, and waste management practices that are prime opportunities for development of high volume waste reduction, reuse and recycling programs. Improved materials management and waste management programs in schools and other institutions across the state will contribute significantly to local governments' ability to meet or exceed AB 939 goals.

A partnership between the school districts, local governments and the Board has significant benefits for both partners. School officials and managers are not experts in the management of wastes or mindful of the

opportunities the materials management system provides for cost savings and other benefits; and

WHEREAS, A partnership with the Board and local governments provides schools with the expertise to achieve financial, educational, and community benefits. The partnership also provides the Board an opportunity to develop the staff expertise and program techniques with which to implement a model program statewide, thereby enhancing the probability of meeting AB 939 goals. As with any good partnership, mutual and respective objectives are achieved that could not be achieved otherwise; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Recycling Program plans to work with no fewer than five schools and up to eight schools to offer technical support to implement comprehensive efforts at schools sites that incorporate waste reduction, recycling, composting and procurement of recycled products.

A sample of projects we are currently considering include:

Retread tire surfaces for playgrounds

Recycled playground equipment

Reused and or recycled gardening materials

Permanent dishes and dishwashers in cafeteria

Composting collection program

Capital for environmental enhancements

The specific deliverables include:

Develop selection criterion

Identify and Evaluate schools for selection

Identify Site-specific, Appropriate Projects

Develop, Plan and Implement Projects

Monitor and Maintain School Model Efforts

Evaluate Projects and Create Reports

WHEREAS, The City Administrator is requesting a waiver of "indirect cost" for the administrative fees subject to be incurred upon, The City and County of San Francisco during the grant "accept and expend" procedure; and

WHEREAS, The California Integrated Waste Management Board has approved a grant of \$50,000 in funds for school waste prevention and recycling programs;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the City Administrator to accept and expend \$50,000 grant from the California Integrated Waste Management Board; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby waive indirect costs; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That although the City has incurred no legal obligation, the Board of Supervisors does hereby ratify the action previously taken.
