 2 EXPRESSING APPRECIATION FOR THE WORK OF THE SAN FRANCISCO PARENT  
 3 TEACHER ASSOCIATION IN PROMOTING SCHOOL AREA SAFETY, URGING THE  
 4 DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND TRAFFIC TO WORK WITH THE SAN FRANCISCO  
 5 PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION, THE SAN FRANCISCO UNIFIED SCHOOL  
 6 DISTRICT, AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN IMPLEMENTING THE PARENT  
 7 TEACHER ASSOCIATION'S RECOMMENDATIONS AND REQUESTING THAT THE  
 8 DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND TRAFFIC REPORT BACK TO THE BOARD OF  
 9 SUPERVISORS ON TEN SCHOOL TEST SITES BY JANUARY 2001.

10 WHEREAS, Safety of our City's children and the families at and  
 11 around all of San Francisco's public and private pre-K to 12 schools  
 12 are of critical importance to the Board of Supervisors, Board of  
 13 Education, the San Francisco Unified School District, the San  
 14 Francisco Parent Teacher Association, and all City agencies; and

15 WHEREAS, The San Francisco PTA has worked hard over the past  
 16 four years to identify safety issues at and around SFUSD schools and  
 17 to create solutions for these issues and recently approved a "School  
 18 PTA Traffic Safety Resolution," which summarizes its recommendations;  
 19 and

20 WHEREAS, The SFUSD Board of Education further, has adopted the  
 21 SF PTA's resolution as a foundation for supporting School Traffic  
 22 Safety and Pedestrian Safety in the SFUSD's Resolution No. 05-23A8  
 23 recognizing the District's counterparts in City and State government  
 24 who have made traffic and pedestrian safety issues a legislative  
 25 priority; now therefore be it

1 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County  
2 of San Francisco hereby expresses its appreciation for the work by  
3 the San Francisco PTA presented in it's PTA SCHOOL SAFETY PROJECT  
4 2000 REPORT, which not only highlighted issues of safety at and  
5 around SFUSD schools, but further developed Citywide recommendations  
6 and assisted the City of San Francisco and partner agencies in the  
7 comprehensive planning, pursuing and implementing viable solutions to  
8 those issues; and be it further

9 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County  
10 of San Francisco hereby urges the Department of Parking and Traffic  
11 to prepare an analysis of critical school traffic and pedestrian  
12 safety problems, and a strategic plan for addressing traffic and  
13 pedestrian safety issues in a systematic fashion for all SFUSD  
14 schools, using the SFUSD/PTA Resolution attached hereto as a  
15 foundation in order to identify areas of responsibility and support  
16 local and State legislation for the City and State governments in  
17 implementing the recommendations and solutions brought forth, provide  
18 for responsive systemic efforts in program coordination and funding,  
19 as well as specific budget recommendations and a rapid timeline for  
20 program implementation, including a sustainable plan for school  
21 traffic engineering devices, sign upgrades and maintenance, safety  
22 educational outreach to students and parents, and an ongoing  
23 enforcement plan; and be it further

24 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County  
25 of San Francisco hereby urges the Department of Parking and Traffic  
to report back to the Board of Supervisors regarding this item, and

1 the results of the upgrade installations at the ten test schools  
2 selected by the San Francisco PTA and the SFUSD by January 2001, in  
3 order to make it possible for the Board of Supervisors to consider  
4 and plan for the implementation of the program at all of San  
5 Francisco's school sites, in combination with developing and testing  
6 educational and enforcement plans and methodology for the 2000-2001  
7 school year; and be it finally

8       RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County  
9 of San Francisco hereby urges the Department of Parking and Traffic,  
10 the San Francisco Police Department, City officials and other  
11 agencies to work closely with the Sand Francisco Unified School  
12 District, the Board of Education, and the San Francisco Parent  
13 Teacher Association and other parent and community groups to ensure a  
14 collaborative and unified ongoing approach to support legislation  
15 that addresses the safety needs of the City's children and their  
16 families.




