WHEREAS, The Women's Building opened in 1979 as the first woman-owned community center in the nation; and,

WHEREAS, The Women's Building offers child care services, programs for gay and straight youths and adults, and public meeting spaces; and,

WHEREAS, Tenants in the Women's Building include the National Organization for Women, Mujeres Unidas Y Activas, the Riley Center, BRAVE/Defending Ourselves, GirlSource, Children of Lesbians and Gays Everywhere, Women Against Rape, and ICON/DykeSpeak; and,

WHEREAS, After six years of planning and construction, the results of a two-year, \$6 million renovation and seismic retrofit were unveiled to the public in a community open house; and,

WHEREAS, The improvements to the Women's Building will allow more groups to meet in the building and an expansion of programs and activities while continuing to focus on low-income women, women of color, and lesbians; and,

WHEREAS, The new Women's Building will continue to be an impressive cultural center for the women of San Francisco; now, therefore, be it




