[Urging FDA Blood Guideline Revisions]

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URGING THE FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION (FDA) AND THE U.S. DEPARTMENT
OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO DISREGARD THE RECENT VOTE BY A PANEL

OF FDA ADVISORS AGAINST ALLOWING HIV-NEGATIVE GAY MEN TO DONATE BLOOD.

WHEREAS, Cities and states across the United States face chronic shortages of blood donations each year; and,

WHEREAS, These blood donations are used to save the lives of millions of Americans and are critical to our health care delivery system; and,

WHEREAS, Maximizing number of people who can safely donate blood is crucial to this system of care; and,

WHEREAS, A panel of scientific advisors to the Food and Drug Administration last week reviewed the blood donor regulations it submits to the Department of Health and Human Services; and,

WHEREAS, The panel considered a proposal to change discriminatory guidelines that ban HIV-negative gay men from donating blood; and,

WHEREAS, This change would have allowed men who have had sex with men within the past five years to donate blood; and,

WHEREAS, Due to scientific advances that can detect the presence of virtually all HIV-infected blood, the proposal did not go far enough to allow HIV-negative gay men to donate blood and should have implemented a one year window period during which gay men could not donate blood; and,

WHEREAS, In a September 14<sup>th</sup> editorial piece, "Change Blood Donation Rules," the San Francisco Chronicle came out in favor of allowing HIV-negative gay men to donate blood; and,

WHEREAS, FDA guidelines should pre-screen potential blood donors by inquiring of safe sex practices and not sexual orientation; and,

WHEREAS, The use of existing policy continues to communicate that there is something inherently dangerous with gay male blood; and,

WHEREAS, The FDA's panel of scientific advisors nonetheless voted 7 to 6 against revising the blood donation guidelines to allow HIV-negative gay men to donate blood; and,

WHEREAS, the FDA and the Department of Health and Human Services are not bound to adhere to this decision and should disregard it as discriminatory and scientifically unjustified; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby urges the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to disregard the recent vote by a panel of FDA advisors against allowing HIV-negative gay men to donate blood.
