[Urging Installation of Colored Bike Lanes and Bike Boxes]

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND TRAFFIC TO CONSIDER THE

INSTALLATION OF COLORED BIKE LANES AND BIKE BOXES AT HIGH-CONFLICT

TRAFFIC AREAS THROUGHOUT THE CITY.

WHEREAS, Colored bike lanes distinguish bike lanes from mixed travel lanes on city streets more effectively than standard bike lanes; and,

WHEREAS, Portland, Oregon has experimented with blue bike lanes at high-conflict traffic areas, including locations where bike lanes cross freeway ramps and discovered improved yielding to bicyclists; and,

WHEREAS, The installation of colored bike lanes on Cesar Chavez Street at the I-280 ramps west of Indiana Street and at the entrance to the future bike bridge at the US 101 North on ramp could improve traffic safety for bicyclists and motorists; and,

WHEREAS, Bike boxes permit bikes to stop ahead of cars at traffic lights; and,

WHEREAS, Bike boxes are very useful in high-conflict areas with high amounts of bike traffic and where bicyclists have a turn ahead requiring maneuvering across multiple lanes of traffic; and,

WHEREAS, Cambridge, Massachusetts has experimented with bike boxes: and,

WHEREAS, The installation of bike boxes on Market Street at Gough Street westbound for cyclists preparing for the left turn on Valencia Street could improve traffic safety for bicyclists and motorists; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the Department of Parking and Traffic to consider the installation of colored bike lanes and bike boxes at high-conflict traffic areas throughout the City.
