URGING SAN FRANCISCO GAS STATIONS TO STOP USING GASOLINE THAT CONTAINES THE ADDITIVE MTBE.]

WHEREAS, MTBE, or methyl tertiary butyl ether, was added to vehicle fuels after Congress amended the Clean Air Act in 1990 to require the use of oxygenates in regions with poor air quality; and,

WHEREAS, While MTBE helped clean the air, it has been found to create harmful emissions and is now widely blamed for contaminating reservoirs and groundwater supplies throughout California; and,

WHEREAS, MTBE seeps into groundwater from leaking gasoline storage tanks and pipelines; and,

WHEREAS, MTBE is uniquely resistant to clean-up; and,

WHEREAS, The problem of contamination by MTBE is likely to linger for years or even decades; and,

WHEREAS, Last year California Governor Gray Davis issued an executive order calling for a ban on the use of MTBE by the end of 2002; and,

WHEREAS, Despite the order by Governor Davis, the use of MTBE increased in California from the first to second quarter of the year; and,

WHEREAS, The amount of MTBE blended into gasoline by Northern California refineries increased by 14% from April to June 2000; and,

WHEREAS, Given its known harmful effects and the fact that use of MTBE is increasing, there should be an immediate ban on the use of MTBE; and,
