WHEREAS, In June of 2000, after almost 2 decades of securing a presence in San Francisco's Mission District, the Instituto expanded their services to the East Bay with the Grand Opening of their Oakland office; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby commends the Instituto Laboral de la Raza for their commitment to protecting workers' rights as well as their dedication to ensuring that social and economic needs are met within the Latino community.
