[Commending the African American Tobacco Free Project and the Fabulous Forty for their work on tobacco control]

Resolution commending the San Francisco African American Tobacco Free Project (SFAATFP) and the forty African American religious institutions representing Bay Area churches, temples, and mosques (hereinafter referred to as the "Fabulous Forty"), for their endless effort to free their community from the deadly grasp of nicotine addiction, and their decision not to accept any funding from tobacco companies.

WHEREAS, tobacco-related deaths continue to be the number one cause for African Americans, claiming 40,000 lives a year; and

WHEREAS, tobacco-related deaths claim more lives than violence, AIDS, car accidents, and (non-tobacco-related) cancer COMBINED; and,

WHEREAS, the Tobacco Industry continues to spend million of dollars annually on advertising that specifically targets the African American community; and,

WHEREAS, the Tobacco Industry seeks to legitimize the death and destruction it reeks on our community by sponsoring church activities, cultural events, scholarships, and other self-serving philanthropic causes. This sponsorship and funding buys silence in communities of color who disproportionately share death and disability from tobacco products; and,

WHEREAS, in 1994, over 4,000 pages of secret documents were unfolded in Congress, proving that as early as 1950 the Tobacco Industry knew that smoking (tobacco) caused cancer and that "nicotine was addictive"; and,

WHEREAS, the Tobacco Industry spends over \$638 million of dollars per year advertising tobacco products; and,

WHEREAS, Secondhand smoke triggers asthma in children, and African American **Supervisor Maxwell ** , Newsom, Leno, Daly BOARD OF SUPERVISORS children suffer from a disproportionately high rate of asthma; and,

WHEREAS, every cigarette smoked has more than 4,000 chemicals. These same chemicals are found in car exhaust, nail polish, window cleaners; and,

WHEREAS, 29.6 million cigarettes, are illegally sold to youth in California each year; and,

WHEREAS, each year, 106,000 children under the age of 18 become daily smokers; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That City and County of San Francisco commends the San Francisco African American Tobacco Free Project (SFAATFP) and the Fabulous Forty, for their endless efforts to free their community from the deadly grasp of nicotine addiction by supporting tobacco control activities, adopting smoke-free policies, and continuing to be a force against the Tobacco Industry.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That City and County of San Francisco pledges to work with the San Francisco African American Tobacco Free Project (SFAATFP) and the "Fabulous Forty", to safeguard the interests of all San Franciscans from the Tobacco Industry by maintaining adequate funding levels for tobacco control activities, continuing to view tobacco as a global issue, and continuing to enact and enforce comprehensive tobacco control measures.
