Resolution supporting Assembly Bill 869 strengthening arts and education in California's Public Schools.

WHEREAS, The arts are critically important to education and learning; and WHEREAS, Studies show that pupils of the arts outperform non-arts educated peers on measures of academic achievement, including the SAT, and strong cognitive links exist between the arts and sciences, cognitive reasoning and the ability to understand abstract ideas; and

WHEREAS, Arts education enhances motivation, self-discipline, and understanding of others, appreciation of diversity, a positive school climate, and prepares students for professional careers; and

WHEREAS, To be eligible for admission into a California State or University of California, pupils must complete a year of visual or performing arts instruction; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 869 authored by Assembly Majority Leader Kevin Shelley would establish The Arts Instructional Materials, Equipment, and Assistance Program; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 869 would provide supplemental funding for school districts to purchase materials, equipment, and supplies for instruction in the arts, including the purchase and repair of musical instruments. Funding would also be available for extended-day programming, before or after school, for arts instruction, and training of teachers by the California Arts Project; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 869 is sponsored by the California State PTA and supported by the State Department of Education and numerous state and local agencies concerned with arts education; now, therefore, be it
