[Urging Ellis Act Revisions.]

Resolution urging members of the State Legislature to introduce amendments to the Ellis Act to prevent evictions.

WHEREAS, San Francisco faces a severe shortage of rental housing, with a vacancy rate of less than four percent; and

WHEREAS, Thousands of rental units are lost each year due to conversion to condominium-type units of single family homes; and,

WHEREAS, Most of these conversions occur through the use of the state Ellis Act; and,

WHEREAS, Evictions in San Francisco have increased by over 300% since 1996; and, WHEREAS, Evictions under the Ellis Act have increased by over 1,000% since 1998; and,

WHEREAS, Reports indicate that over one-third of all Ellis evictions involve seniors, disabled tenants or families with young children; and,

WHEREAS, The Ellis Act is being abused by real estate speculators seeking to circumvent the City's conversion law, with reports indicating that two-thirds of all landlords who bought the building within months evicted tenants under the Ellis Act; and,

WHEREAS, Vulnerable tenants such as senior renters, disabled renters or renters with young children need protections from abuses of the Ellis Act; and,

WHEREAS, The Ellis Act was intended for use by long-time landlords seeking to get out of the business, rather than for use by real estate speculators on newly purchased buildings; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urges our representatives in the State Legislature to introduce amendments to the Ellis Act which would allow cities to prohibit Ellis evictions for tenants who are seniors, disabled and who have children under the age of six; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urges our representatives in the State Legislature to introduce amendments to the Ellis Act which would prohibit the use of the Ellis Act by new purchasers of buildings by requiring a "holding period" wherein a landlord must own a property for at least five years before evicting tenants under the Ellis Act; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to members of the State Legislature representing San Francisco with a request that they take all action necessary to achieve the objectives of this resolution.
