[Resolution to put kids first in allocation of national budget surpluses.]

Resolution urging our congressional delegates to put kids first as they allocate budget surpluses.

WHEREAS, With current budget surpluses there is no excuse for failing to fully fund programs that help kids get the right start in life, like Head Start, child care, after-school programs and child abuse prevention; and,

WHEREAS, The President's budget plan gives virtually the entire non-Social Security surplus away in tax cuts, it appears that funding for programs that help kids get the right start in life will be cut or frozen at levels that don't come close to meeting the full need; and,

WHEREAS, The March 23<sup>rd</sup> edition of The New York Times reported that President Bush plans to cut \$200 million in child care grants, reduce programs that prevent child abuse by 18 percent, and eliminate the Early Learning Opportunities Act, which provides grants to states and localities to support parenting-education programs and quality child development services for children under five; and

WHEREAS The President's proposal to double the \$500 Child Tax Credit to \$1000 excludes 16 million kids in families making under \$20,000 a year, (one in four of the nation's kids); now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of San Francisco urges our congressional delegates to make the Child Tax Credit and the Dependent Care Tax Credit refundable so that kids most at risk get as much help from these tax credits as those in better-off families; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Congress is urged to assure adequate funding for child abuse prevention, child protection, school readiness child care, after-school programs, schools, and the Head Start Program.
