WHEREAS, It is the mission of the San Francisco Treatment on Demand Planning Council to serve as a community planning body that has recently adopted the following key principles to include: 1) That while abstinence is the ultimate goal of any substance abuse treatment system, harm reduction is an important part of addressing the practical realities of and individual's needs; 2) That programs must be culturally competent and sensitive and deal with the complexity of an individual's life situation and requirements for full recovery; 3) That programs must work with the client in the context of her or his family and community so that recovery leads them to an integration with those systems; 4) That programs must work to advance the recovery of the client in the many aspects of their healing, whether that work is through a single program or through the linkage of multiple programs; 5) That while programs should be free to be creative in offering services there must be accountability for both the functioning and outcomes of the program; and 6) That dignity and safety for each client is a paramount concern; and,

WHEREAS, The Treatment on Demand Planning Council has set its funding priorities for Fiscal Year 2001-02 in alignment with its core principles; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors commends the Treatment on Demand Planning Council for adopting its key principles in community dialogue with members of the public; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the Mayor to do everything possible to ensure support and funding for all interventions proposed by the Treatment on Demand Planning Council.
