WHEREAS, The incidence of ovarian cancer is increasing over time with a 30% increase in the number of ovarian cancer cases and an 18% increase in the number of ovarian cancer deaths reported in the past decade (1985-1995), and WHEREAS, Ovarian cancer has been predicted to reach epidemic proportions as the population ages because advancing age is one of the known risk factor for the development of ovarian cancer; and, WHEREAS, The Pap smear is sensitive and specific to the early detection of cervical cancer but not to ovarian cancer, and there is no screening test currently used for the early

detection of ovarian cancer; and, WHEREAS, The symptoms of ovarian cancer are vague and not well known by the public, the majority of ovarian cancer cases (70%) are detected at an advanced stage, and the survival rates for women with advanced ovarian cancer has shown minimal improvement over the last 15-25 years; and,

WHEREAS, If diagnosed and treated at an early stage before the cancer spreads outside of the ovary, the treatment is potentially less costly, and the five-year survival rate is higher (92%)

WHEREAS, There are factors which are known to reduce the risk for ovarian cancer and play an important role in the prevention of the disease; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors designate September of every year as Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month; and, be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That by this designation of Ovarian Cancer Awareness
