WHEREAS, in the early 1850's, the area bounded by Montgomery, Pacific, Jackson, and Kearny Streets was home to many Chilean immigrants and was known as 'Little Chile"; and,

WHEREAS, the contributions of Chilean Americans to the United States is immeasurable and their descendants continue to contribute to the multicultural society of the United States and San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Works Code, Section 789.2a, the Board of Supervisors may, by resolution, designate a specific location on a public street or place to commemorate a site, event, or person of historical interest to San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, The government of Chile acting by and through its counsel general have prepared such a plaque now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco commends the contributions of Chilean Americans to the development of the City of San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco further recognizes the contributions of Chilean Americans by authorizing the placement of a plaque in the sidewalk on the corner of Kearny and Jackson Streets which recognizes and celebrates such history and contributions.
