3 **Resolution appointing Vincent Rios, Bud Wilson, and Aaron Zeff, terms ending January**  
4 **31, 2003, to the Veterans Affairs Commission, residency requirement waived.**

6 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco  
7 does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Veterans  
8 Affairs Commission, pursuant to the provisions of the San Francisco Administrative Code,  
9 Section 5.102, for the term specified:

10 Vincent Rios (residency requirement waived), succeeding Charles Coolidge, deceased,  
11 seat 7, must be a person who served in the Armed Forces of the United States of America  
12 and is suffering from a physical disability arising from that service, in accordance with the  
13 definitions applied in such cases by the Veterans' Administration, unexpired portion of a four-  
14 year term ending January 31, 2003;

15 Bud Wilson, succeeding Maceo May, seat 8, must be an at-large appointment,  
16 unexpired portion of a four-year term ending January 31, 2003;

17 Aaron Zeff, succeeding Robert De La Cruz, seat 11, must be an at-large appointment,  
18 unexpired portion of a four-year term ending January 31, 2003; and, be it

19 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 20 1. The membership of the Veterans Affairs Commission has a goal to be  
21 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- 22 2. Applicant Vincent Rios, a new appointee, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is  
23 a person with experience that uniquely qualifies him/her to serve on the Veterans  
24 Affairs Commission.

The Veterans Affairs Commission has attempted to fill the position, for which Vincent Rios was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Vincent Rios is qualified to serve on the Veterans Affairs Commission.

4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Veterans Affairs Commission at this time; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Vincent Rios, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
