WHEREAS, "Living Proof," Sylvester, and the many who made the activities of March 11, 1979 at the San Francisco Opera House possible will be remembered through an event on March 22, 2004 in the Herbst Theatre in the San Francisco War Memorial Performing Arts Center; and

WHEREAS, Martha Wash, Danny Glover, Bishop Yvette Flunder, Edwin Hawkins, Shirley Miller, Daryl Coley, Emmit Powell and the Gospel Elites, Rev.
