WHEREAS, The Schlage Lock company operated a large plant in the Visitacion Valley section of San Francisco for the better part of a century, providing jobs for areas residents and serving as a key part of the community; and,

WHEREAS, Ingersoll Rand, the parent company of Schlage Lock, closed the plant in 1999, indicating a desire to sell the property; and,

WHEREAS, In 2000, the Board of Supervisors imposed a series of interim zoning controls for the area in order to prevent inappropriate development and to allow a communitybased planning process to proceed; and,

WHEREAS, The Office of Supervisor Maxwell and the San Francisco Planning Department sponsored a series of community planning workshops in the winter and spring of 2002 to formulate a community plan for the re-use of the approximately 12-acre "Schlage" Lock" site and an adjacent 8-acre site; and,

WHEREAS, This community planning effort, involving several hundred residents of Visitacion Valley and surrounding neighborhoods, produced the Visitacion Valley Strategic Concept Plan, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. 0504 and is incorporated herein by reference; and,

WHEREAS, This Strategic Concept Plan envisions a mix of housing, open space, community-oriented retail and community-oriented institutional uses, laid out so as to become an integral part of the neighborhood; and,

WHEREAS, The vision expressed in the *Strategic Concept Plan* has broad support from community stakeholders; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board supports use of the *Strategic Concept Plan* in all planning efforts in the Visitacion Valley; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board urges the Planning Commission to urge the Planning Department's Major Environmental Analysis Division to consider the *Strategic Concept Plan* as a part of the environmental analysis for any development proposal on the properties that were studied in the Plan and, where applicable, on properties in the vicinity; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board urges the affected property owners to embrace the vision expressed in the *Strategic Concept Plan* as part of any development proposals on the properties that were studied in the Plan and to collaborate with community stakeholders throughout the development process; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board recognizes that any development proposals on the properties that were studied in the *Strategic Concept Plan* must undergo further refinement, a thorough community process, and full environmental review.
