[Appointment - Asthma Task Force]

Resolution appointing Natasha Madaris, Micah McLorin and Anjali Nath, terms ending June 30, 2005, to the Asthma Task Force, residency requirement waived.

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Asthma Task Force, pursuant to the provisions of the San Francisco Administrative Code, Chapter 19A, Article II, for the term specified:

Natasha Madaris (residency requirement waived), succeeding LeConte Dill, seat 1, resigned, must be a representative of a community-based organization that provides advocacy related to asthma issues in San Francisco and is a voting member, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 30, 2005.

Micah McLorin, succeeding Carl Rose, seat 13, resigned, must be a representative of lung health/asthma-specific organizations and is a voting member, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 30, 2005.

Anjali Nath (residency requirement waived), succeeding Beth Saiki, seat 14, resigned, must be a representative of lung health/asthma-specific organizations and is a voting member, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 30, 2005; and, be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 1. The membership of the Asthma Task Force has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- Applicants Natasha Madaris and Anjali Nath, new appointees, who are not residents of San Francisco, are persons with experience that uniquely qualifies them to serve on the Asthma Task Force.

- 3. The Asthma Task Force has attempted to fill the positions, for which Natasha Madaris and Anjali Nath were nominated, with individuals who are City residents and who have the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Natasha Madaris and Anjali Nath are qualified to serve on the Asthma Task Force.
- 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there are no other possible representatives, who are residents of San Francisco and who have the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by these applicants, and who are willing to serve on the Asthma Task Force at this time; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Natasha Madaris and Anjali Nath, as allowed in cases where no qualified City residents, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
