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3 **Resolution recognizing the 50th Anniversary Celebration of the San Francisco Chapter**
4 **of the Construction Specifications Institute and commending that Chapter and its**

8 WHEREAS, on September 17, 2005, the San Francisco Chapter of the Construction
9 Specifications Institute (CSI) will honor and celebrate the occasion of the Chapter's 50th
10 Anniversary; and

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12 WHEREAS, CSI is a non-profit organization founded at the end of World War II to
13 create order out of chaos in written construction contract documents; and

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15 WHEREAS, the efforts of a dedicated group of construction professionals resulted in
16 the CSI MasterFormat, which is the organizational framework upon which construction
17 documents for all buildings and structures are predicated; and

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19 WHEREAS, CSI has expanded from its initial task and interest in the written word
20 pertaining to construction documents to include all aspects of construction-related agencies,
21 attorneys, educators, and professional construction product representatives; and

23 WHEREAS, the Chapter provides a forum for dissemination and discussion of
24 construction-related information through seminars, special monthly presentations, continuing
25 technical education, and ProFair, an annual trade show for manufacturers to display their
products and systems; and

1 WHEREAS, the Chapter members recognize the value of trustworthy networking and
2 reliable information obtained from like-minded professionals; and

3 WHEREAS, CSI has acknowledged that students contribute to the perpetuation of the
4 Institute's vision, and the San Francisco CSI Chapter ardently promotes and fully supports
5 student activities and education; and

6 WHEREAS, nineteen of the San Francisco Chapter members have been conferred a
7 prestigious Institute Fellowship status for their important contributions to the construction
8 industry, and several members serve in CSI regional and national leadership positions; and

10 WHEREAS, the CSI San Francisco mission "To become the most vital organization in
11 the construction community, serving as the catalyst for technical excellence in education" and
12 the Chapter motto "To provide the tools to build" guides the Chapter's many activities; now,
13 therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors, City and County of San Francisco
15 recognizes the CSI 50th Anniversary Celebration in San Francisco and commends the San
16 Francisco Chapter and its many volunteers on this 17th day of September, 2005, for
