[Supporting H.R. 5161, the "Commission on Mexican-American Removal during 1929-1941 Act'] Resolution supporting H.R. 5161, the "Commission on Mexican-American Removal

during 1929-1941 Act."

WHEREAS, United States Congresswoman Hilda L. Solis (D-CA) introduced on April 6, 2006, H.R. 5161, or the "Commission on Mexican-American Removal during 1929-1941 Act"; and,

WHEREAS, The Commission would mark the first official study of a dark period in U.S. history that saw as many as 2 million U.S. residents of Mexican heritage, some of them U.S. citizens, forcibly removed to Mexico or harassed into emigrating to Mexico; and,

WHEREAS, The period of Mexican removal is mentioned very little if at all in the ten most commonly used U.S. history textbooks for middle and high school students; and,

WHEREAS, The stated purpose of the removal of Mexican-Americans during the Great Depression was, according to the authorities at the time, to keep scarce jobs for "real Americans" rather than Mexican-Americans; and,

WHEREAS, Mexican-Americans were deported and harassed all over the United States, including Illinois, Michigan, Texas, Arizona, New York, New Mexico and California; and,

WHEREAS, Some of those deported from the United States during this period had served in the U.S. military during World War I; and,

WHEREAS, During the Great Depression, Mexican-Americans faced a wide variety of hostile acts from all levels of government, including raids in public places, the withholding of jobs by governments and private companies, the denial of public aid, and forced departures in guarded trains or cars; and,

Supervisor Sandoval BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, On October 7, 2005, California State Senator Joe Dunn's bill expressing an apology on behalf of California for its role in the removal of Mexican-Americans during the Great Depression became law; and,

WHEREAS, H.R. 5161 has the support of the National Council of La Raza, the National Association of Latino Elected Officials, the Mexican American Legal Defense and Education Fund, and the American GI Forum, among many other groups; and,

WHEREAS, The history of Mexican removal during the Great Depression serves as a cautionary tale considering the passage by the House of Representatives of a bill that would make it a felony to be an undocumented resident of the United States; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco supports H.R. 5161, or the "Commission on Mexican-American Removal during 1929-1941 Act"; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall send copies of this resolution to Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi and Senators Barbara Boxer and Dianne Feinstein.
