Resolution urging the United States Congress to save the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP), restore the thousands of Seniors cut from the program last year and to expand the program to meet the increasing need for America's Seniors.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Food Bank administers the CSFP program and provides a monthly food box from the United States Department of Agriculture to 9,600 people in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The program serves a majority of low-income seniors in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Every food box is filled with nutritious foods seniors need to maintain their health, like canned tuna and chicken, cheese, rice, cereal, fruits and vegetables; and

WHEREAS, Last year 900 low-income seniors in San Francisco were cut from the program as Congress approved cuts to the program and the United States Department of Agriculture increased the cost of the food but not the funding; and,

WHEREAS, Participants in the program must have a monthly income below \$1,100 to qualify for CSFP; and

WHEREAS, The CSFP program is cost-effective, with the food box valued at \$50 yet costing the United States Department of Agriculture only \$16 per box; and

WHEREAS, CSFP is the only federal commodity program that provides participants with a nutritionally balanced food source each month; and

WHEREAS, The Bush Administration has proposed to completely eliminate the program in the coming fiscal year and the U.S. Department of Agriculture has not included CSFP in the reauthorization of the 2007 Farm Bill; and

WHEREAS, This program helped feed more than 500,000 low income seniors each month last year across the country and more than 53,000 seniors per month in California alone; and

WHEREAS, This supplemental food program has been in effect for more than two decades; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the United States Congress to restore full funding of \$157 Million to the Commodity Supplemental Food Program.
