Resolution Proclaiming May 1, 2007 as Immigrant Workers Day in San Francisco.

WHEREAS, May 1 commemorates the beginning of labor unrest that led to the Haymarket Riot of 1886 in Chicago, Illinois; and,

WHEREAS, Many countries celebrate May 1 as International Worker's Day; and,

WHEREAS, Because of these and other antecedents, May 1 has become an international celebration of the social and economic achievements of the working class and labor movement; and,

WHEREAS, May 1, 2006 was chosen by immigrant groups in the United States as the day for the Great American Boycott, in which millions of immigrants and their supporters did not go to work, missed school and left home to march on the streets demanding better conditions for an estimated 12 million undocumented immigrants; and,

WHEREAS, An estimated 750,000 people protested in San Francisco on the same date, indicative of the imperative need for comprehensive immigration reform and compassionate laws; and,

WHEREAS, Although multitudinous, this demonstration indeed was peaceful, well organized and caused no disruptions to the city but clearly made a statement in support of immigrants who live here regardless of their legal status; and,

WHEREAS, This demonstration was organized by a coalition of immigrant rights and multiethnic groups, churches, unions, youth and anti-war groups and pro-justice organizations who operated independently but gathered under the name of "Coalision Primero de Mayo" or "May 1 Coalition;" and,

WHEREAS, The city recognizes the contributions of immigrant workers, regardless of their legal status, to the city's economy; therefore, be it,
