Resolution encouraging security contractors and building owners to come to the bargaining table with the single purpose to improve industry standards by providing adequate training and increased wages and benefits for private security officers.

WHEREAS, More than one million private security officers, or more than twice the number of police officers, are employed in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Private security is one of the ten fastest growing occupations in the United States whose workforce is disproportionately drawn from the African American, Filipino and immigrant communities; and

WHEREAS. The events of September 11, 2001 emphasized the value of private security officers in protecting lives and property; and

WHEREAS, Many private security officers in the Bay Area are working two to three jobs to sustain their families, and are without affordable family health coverage; and

WHEREAS, Offering Bay Area private security officers wages and benefits in parity with janitorial workers would grow the Bay Area economy by approximately \$7,000,000 annually; and

WHEREAS, On June 28, 2007, one thousand Bay Area security officers are launching the Stand for Security Campaign 2007; and

WHEREAS, Renegotiations of the master contract offers an opportunity to professionalize the private security workforce by providing enhanced training and emergency preparedness; and

WHEREAS, The private security industry is encouraged to develop a career ladder with standards for unbiased hiring and promotions including compensation commensurate with the duties and responsibilities; and be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors encourages security contractors and building owners to come to the bargaining table with a single purpose: to

improve industry standards by providing adequate training and increased wages and benefits for private security officers; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors stands with private security officers who deserve a better quality of life for themselves and their families; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims June 28, 2007 as Bay Area Private Security Officers Day in San Francisco, in recognition of the National Stand for Security Campaign 2007.
