Resolution urging the federal government to impose stricter regulations on international ship traffic and supporting the Marine Vessel Emissions Reduction Act of 2007.

WHEREAS, Despite numerous catastrophic oil spills in recent decades, the federal government has not yet implemented a requirement that all oil tankers have a double-hull;

WHEREAS, Similarly, the United States Coast Guard has failed to prohibit the discharging of ballast water in the territorial waters of the United States; and,

WHEREAS, The discharging of ballast water in coastal and internal waterways leads to the introduction of invasive species and the degradation of our nation's coasts; and,

WHEREAS, While ocean going vessels contribute nearly three percent of global warming causing emissions, the federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has failed to take a lead in regulating emissions from these vessels; and,

WHEREAS, Because the EPA has failed to implement stringent standards for ocean going vessels, Representative Hilda Solis has introduced H.R. 2548, the Marine Vessel Emissions Reduction Act of 2007, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 0715 73  $\tilde{R}$ , and is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and.

WHEREAS, H.R. 2548 will require ocean going vessels to use fuels which contain less than 1,000 parts per million of sulfur; and,

WHEREAS, The recent 58,000 gallon oil spill on the San Francisco Bay and the 560,000 gallon oil spill on the Black Sea are the latest examples of the environmental damage that ocean going vessels can cause; and,

vessels docking in the United States to meet stringent safety standards; now, therefore, be

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors calls upon the federal government to implement environmental regulations for ocean going vessels to address global warming, prevent and minimize oil spills, eliminate the discharging of ballast water at sea and mitigate all other environmental impacts caused by these vessels; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco's supports H.R. 2548 and declares that the bill is the first in a series of necessary steps to regulate the environmental impact of ocean going vessels; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges San Francisco's congressional delegation to support H.R. 2548 and all other attempts by the federal government to decrease the environmental impact caused by marine vessels; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board directs the Clerk of the Board to send a copy of this resolution to Speaker Pelosi, Senator Boxer and Senator Feinstein.
