Resolution authorizing the Sheriff’s Department to apply for a 12-month grant in an amount not to exceed \$ 1,000,000 from the Corrections Standards Authority for the Mentally Ill Offenders Crime Reduction (MIOCR) Grant Program.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is seeking state funds available through the Mentally Ill Offender Crime Reduction (MIOCR) grant program administered by the Corrections Standards Authority (hereafter referred to as CSA), and is requiring grantees to provide 25% local match of the grant amount; and,

WHEREAS, The State requires that the Board of Supervisors authorize the Sheriff to apply for such funding; and,

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment. The grant funded Deputy Probation Officer position is a continuation from FY 2007-2008 and has been included in Adult Probation’s FY 2008-2009 annual budget request; and,

WHEREAS, The Sheriff’s Department proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and be it



5 grant funds to supplant expenditures controlled by this body; and be it




