2 funds associated with a Secure Reentry Program Facility.]

3 **Resolution authorizing the Sheriff's Department to execute contracts with the**
4 **California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) and accept and**
5 **expend funds associated with the contracts. The purpose of the contract is to**
6 **establish a pilot San Francisco County Secure Reentry Program Facility (SRPF) that**
7 **will provide up to 12 months of intensive, in-custody evidence based reentry**
8 **programming which will address the offender's underlying employment, mental health**
9 **and substance abuse issues. This will be followed by 12 months of accountability**
10 **based out-of-custody reentry programming.**

11 WHEREAS, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed into law AB900, the Public
12 Safety and Offender Rehabilitation Services Act of 2007; and,

13 WHEREAS, The legislation fundamentally improves the corrections system and
14 introduces a model where smaller facilities and stronger rehabilitation programs prepare
15 offenders for life outside prison; and,

16 WHEREAS, The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR)
17 seeks to enter into contract with San Francisco County for the purpose of developing a
18 collaborative approach designed to reduce recidivism among San Francisco's offender
19 population and enhance public safety; and,


20 WHEREAS, The San Francisco County Sheriff's Office, the San Francisco District
21 Attorney and CDCR, are committed to a collaborative approach to the problem of recidivism,
22 by combining the expertise of local government, law enforcement and local community
23 services organizations in order to provide a seamless transition from inmate to parolee. A
24 team approach to preparing a parolee to succeed in the community will enhance public safety
25 and enhance the parolee's chances of remaining crime free in the community; and,

1 WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco Sheriff's Department is the agency
2 charged with the care and confinement of arrested persons for the City and County of San
3 Francisco; now, therefore, be it

4 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco County Sheriff, or his designee, is hereby
5 authorized to execute any contracts with the California Department of Corrections and
6 Rehabilitation and accept and expend any funds associated with these contracts for the
7 purpose of care and confinement of State inmates in a Secure Reentry Program Facility
8 (SRPF). Said contracts are authorized for a minimum of two years duration effective upon
9 signature of the San Francisco County Sheriff, or his designee.


