[Taxi Medallion Fees.]

Resolution urging the SFMTA to examine and consider taxicab medallion fees.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) is facing a \$129 million deficit, in the context of an unprecedented budget shortfall confronting the City and County of San Francisco for the 2009-2010 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, After assuming jurisdiction over the taxi industry in March 2009, SFMTA has asked the taxi industry to contribute between \$5 and \$20 million to close the budget gap; and,

WHEREAS, The primary policy option under consideration for this industry contribution is to make taxi medallions transferable in the private sector through the auctioning of taxi medallions, which would raise one-time revenues for the City; and,

WHEREAS, SFMTA has not adequately explored an alternative to generate significant revenues from the taxi industry -- a "rental fee" on City-owned medallions, which would create a continuous, long-term revenue stream for the SFMTA, the City and the taxi industry; and,

WHEREAS, New York City's experience auctioning medallions has raised concerns that medallion ownership would consolidate among large companies and discourage competition, rather than distribute medallion ownership among drivers; and,

WHEREAS, In its "Making Taxi Service Work in San Francisco" report on potential reforms to the taxi system, the San Francisco Planning and Urban Research Association (SPUR) concluded that a system of non-transferable medallions is critical to improving the quality of taxi service; and

WHEREAS, Ongoing revenue generated from a medallion rental fee structure could be used to help finance much-needed customer service improvements, such as a centralized dispatch system, and assistance to drivers who lack health and retirement benefits; and

WHEREAS, Current and former SFMTA commissioners, SFMTA staff, staff of the former Taxi Commission, voters in San Francisco who previously voted down 8 propositions to amend Prop K and make medallions transferable, the United Taxi Workers, San Francisco Taxi Cab Company, Green Cab, the Asian Law Caucus, and a majority of non-medallion holding and medallion-holding drivers have expressed significant concerns about a medallion auction system; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the SFMTA to examine and consider the policy and budgetary alternative of a medallion rental fee, as the SFMTA prepares to present its balanced budget proposal to the Board by May 1st, 2009.
