[Need for Multilingual 2010 Census Advance Letter]

Resolution calling for an inclusive and multilingual advance letter in the 2010 Census

WHEREAS, In advance of each decennial Census, the United States Census Bureau issues an informational letter notifying all households of the upcoming Census count process; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco has a large number of foreign-born and non-English speaking residents, where over 270,000 are immigrants, 61% from Asian countries, 21% from Latin America, and over 325,000 San Francisco residents speak a language other than English at home; and

WHEREAS, In advance of the 2000 Census, the U.S. Census Bureau sent an advance letter to all San Francisco residents that provided information in five non-English languages, including Spanish, Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese and Tagalog; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Census Bureau has decided to provide the 2010 Census advance letter in only English to most households, and in English and Spanish in some areas; and

WHEREAS, The California Constitution requires reapportionment of the State electoral districts based on data collected through the decennial Census, and the San Francisco City Charter requires Census data to apportion legislative districts for the eleven-member Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, A significant number of San Francisco residents will have difficulties understanding the proposed 2010 advance letter and are unlikely to respond if the letter does not provide information in multiple languages; and

WHEREAS, at least 100,000 San Francisco residents were left out of the 2000 Census, costing the City over \$300 million in federal dollars over the past 10 years; and

WHEREAS, An inaccurate 2010 Census count would deprive San Francisco of hundreds of millions of dollars in government funding, hinder the City's ability to provide vital services to its residents, and potentially distort electoral districts in the reapportionment process; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco urges the United States Census Bureau to institute policies that do not undermine the accuracy of the Census, especially in counting the residents of San Francisco; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco calls specifically on the United States Census Bureau to send a multilingual advance letter to every household in San Francisco; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco urges its

Congressional delegation to advocate for a multilingual advance letter to support an equitable

2010 Census process.
