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[Opposing the Safe, Clean, and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act of 2010]

Resolution opposing the Safe, Clean, and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act of 2010.

WHEREAS. The Legislature and the Governor have placed on the November 2010 ballot a water bond measure known as the Safe, Clean, and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act of 2010, that will authorize the sale of \$11.14 billion in general obligation bonds; and

WHEREAS, This measure raises significant fiscal concerns for the City and County of San Francisco, including the impact of increasing diversions of State General Fund revenue from essential services towards bond repayment (estimated to grow from 6% to 10% of General Fund revenues by 2014) on the ability of the State to fulfill its financial obligations to the City and County of San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, This measure raises significant concerns about its impact on the poorest San Franciscans, who rely on services provided by the State that have been increasingly minimized due to the continuing State deficit, which is expected to continue at high levels (approximately \$20 billion annually) for several more years; and,

WHEREAS, California State Treasurer Bill Lockyer specifically warned the Legislature in October 2009 that "further increasing the General Fund's debt burden... would require cutting even deeper into crucial services already reeling from billions of dollars in reductions. The case for user-funding for most water system improvements is compelling, both as a matter of equity and fiscal prudence"; and,

WHEREAS, This measure raises significant environmental concerns for San Francisco Bay, including the potential for increased water exports from the Delta resulting from the construction of a Peripheral Canal that will reduce fresh water inflows to the Bay, further degrading the ecosystem of the largest estuary on the West Coast of the Americas; and,

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WHEREAS, The measure provides \$3 billion in funding for construction of environmentally destructive dams, yet fails to provide sufficient funding or any new protections or new water supplies to help revive the State's crashing salmon runs, which have cost coastal economies, including San Francisco's, millions of dollars in lost revenue over the past three years; and,

WHEREAS, Billions of dollars of voter approved water bonds remain unsold, and can be used to provide significant environmental benefits to the State; and,

WHEREAS, This water bond is already opposed by leading environmental organizations and, according to polls, a majority of likely California voters; and,

WHEREAS, Senators Mark Leno and Leland Yee, as well as Assembly member Tom Ammiano, voted against placing this bond on the ballot; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco joins the majority of its State legislators in opposing the water bond on the November ballot and urges San Francisco voters to reject it; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Legislature, when considering future bond measures, to explore funding strategies that do not disproportionately impact the most vulnerable Californians; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Legislature to support actions that help restore the ecological health of San Francisco Bay and Delta by taking actions to reduce the amount of water diverted from the Bay and Delta.
