Resolution supporting Assembly Bill 877, which would remove one of the major barriers to self sufficiency for formerly incarcerated people by increasing their chances of obtaining a drivers license.

RESOLUTION NO. |77 - ||

WHEREAS, AB 877, introduced by Assembly Member Skinner, would amend and expand the California Vehicle Code to allow eligible incarcerated persons and persons previously incarcerated in county jails, who have non-felony vehicle code violations pending, the opportunity to obtain or renew a driver's license.

WHEREAS, there are approximately 80,000 county jail inmates in the State of California; and,

WHEREAS, existing law requires that a person not be subject to prosecution for any non-felony vehicle code offense that is pending against him or her at the time of his or her commitment to state prison; and,

WHEREAS, existing law requires that a driver's license shall not be suspended or revoked or the issuance or renewal of that license be refused as a result of a pending nonfelony offense occurring prior a person being committed to state prison or the Division of Juvenile Facilities; and,

WHEREAS, AB 877 states that it also would apply these provisions to a person upon completion of his or her sentence of 6 months or longer in a county jail; and,

WHEREAS, AB 877 states that it would also apply these provisions and the exemption from the prosecution to a person who has been incarcerated for 90 or more days in County Jail in any consecutive 12-month period subsequent to the date of the offense or violation; and,

Supervisor Mirkarimi BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, AB 877 states that it would require a court that receives a valid request to search its records for eligible pending matters and dispose of each eligible non-felony offense pursuant to these provisions, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco recognizes that one of the surest ways to assist defendants and formerly incarcerated persons' reintegration into society is to assure they are employable and able to care for themselves and their families; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco recognizes that the ability to obtain a drivers license will likely decrease the risk of recidivism and encourage the formerly incarcerated person to obtain employment legally and safely; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco recognizes that Assembly Bill 877 brings consistency to the current law, by making reentry remedies that are available to individuals sentenced to prison also available to individuals sentenced to County Jail; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco fully supports and endorses this legislative piece due to its potential positive impact on the people and City & County of San Francisco; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco recognizes that the aforementioned amendment to California State law is necessary for the betterment of San Francisco when addressing recidivism and reintegration of formerly incarcerated persons and the rights of currently incarcerated individuals.
