Resolution authorizing the Port of San Francisco to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$70,000 from the State of California Coastal Conservancy, through the Association of Bay Area Governments Bay Trail Project Program, for the Cargo Way Bicycle Lane Improvement Project along Cargo Way between Third and Jennings Streets as part of the Blue Greenway project.

[Accept and Expend Grant - Cargo Way Bicycle Lane Improvement Project - \$70,000]

WHEREAS, the Cargo Way Bicycle Lane Improvement is a ¾ of a mile roadway within the Port's jurisdiction which was constructed in the early 1970's to provide access and infrastructure to the India Basin Industrial Park and the Port's cargo operations. The Cargo Way Bicycle Lane Improvement project is also the location of the Blue Greenway, Bay Trail and planned local and regional bicycle system improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the existing condition of Cargo Way precludes safe pedestrian and bicycle access and is currently a significant gap in the Blue Greenway, Bay Trail and bicycle systems; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed project includes reconfiguring the existing roadway to accommodate a Class 1 bicycle facility along the length of the roadway, which will improve access to/from the southeast San Francisco neighborhoods to downtown and close a gap along the City's southern waterfront open space system referred to as the Blue Greenway; and,

WHEREAS, the San Francisco Bay Trail Project is a program administered by the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG), designed to provide funding to accelerate the development of the Bay Trail; and,

WHEREAS, ABAG, through its San Francisco Bay Trail Project, has found the Cargo Way Bicycle Improvement Project is eligible for grant funds in the amount of \$70,000 from the Proposition 84 program that it administers to construct segments of the Bay Trail; and.

WHEREAS, the proposed Cargo Way bicycle lane improvements are consistent with the San Francisco Bicycle Plan, Environmental Impact Report (Case 2007.0347E), certified on June 25, 2009 by the San Francisco Planning Commission and by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors on August 4, 2009; and,

WHEREAS, On July 12, 2011, through Resolution 11-47, the Port Commission authorized Port staff to accept and expend the Association of Bay Area Governments, Bay Trail Link Program funds; and,

WHEREAS, ABAG did not require a cash or 'in kind' match; and,

WHEREAS, This grant does not create any new positions, and will not require an amendment to the Annual Salary Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, All grant funding will go toward The Cargo Way Bicycle Lane Improvement project, which is also the location of the Blue Greenway, Bay Trail planned bicycle system improvements project; and,

WHEREAS, The grant terms prohibit including indirect costs in the grant budget; and, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the San Francisco
Port Commission to accept and expend \$70,000 in grant funding from ABAG for the
Cargo Way Bicycle Lane Improvement Project; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs as a part of this grant; and be it
