[Urging the Mayor and City Departments to Prioritize Youth Employment During Business Negotiations]

Resolution urging the Mayor and City Departments to include Youth Involvement Plans when negotiating with new businesses coming to San Francisco, in order to increase the number of employment opportunities for San Francisco's young people.

WHEREAS, One third of all San Francisco youth (16-24) are officially unemployed, and actively searching for a job; and

WHEREAS, Youth in San Francisco consistently choose employment as their highest priority need; and

WHEREAS, In the summer of 2011, over 2,000 San Francisco youth applied for only 435 youth employment slots in the Mayor's Youth Employment and Education Program (MYEEP), a youth workforce program, which has provided 14 and 15 year old youth with their first jobs since 1989; and

WHEREAS, Over 700 youth applied for just 200 openings to San Francisco
YouthWorks (SFYW), a youth workforce program, which prepares 16 and 17 year old youth
for careers in the public sector by providing them with internships through City government;
and

WHEREAS, The Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP), a work experience program providing youth ages 16-21 with summer internships, also received more than twice the amount of applications than program spots in the past year; and

WHEREAS, These San Francisco subsidized employment programs have limited capacity due to budget constraints during this challenging economic climate; and

WHEREAS, Despite the recent financial downturn, San Francisco's economic landscape - in particular, our incubation, attraction and retention of technology companies - potentially offers unique employment opportunities to young people; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco has a commitment to retaining vital new companies, as demonstrated in the Central Market/Tenderloin Payroll Tax Exclusion (CMTPTE); and

WHEREAS, Mayor Lee's jobs plan "Roadmap to Good Jobs and Opportunity" emphasizes the importance of apprenticeships, jobs, and internships for San Francisco youth in these new technology companies; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco also has a commitment to consider opportunities for young people, as evidenced in the Youth Involvement Plan required by the 34th America's Cup Host City Agreement, which calls on the City and County of San Francisco, the America's Cup Event Authority and the America's Cup Organizing Committee to develop a "comprehensive strategy for achieving" youth involvement in the America's Cup; and

WHEREAS, The limits of government subsidized employment and the clear need for youth employment for the success of society have been recognized by President Obama through his Summer Jobs+ Plan; and

WHEREAS, On January 31, 2012, at the urging of the Youth Commission, the Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution supporting the design of President Obama's Summer Jobs+ plan and committing to work towards developing and implementing a local version of the plan; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco encourages the Mayor and City departments, including the Office of Economic and Workforce Development, to include Youth Involvement Plans - which would, at minimum, increase the number of work experiences for San Francisco's youth either through the provision of unpaid internships and apprenticeships or by an in lieu contribution of funds to San Francisco's youth

employment programs, and which would be coordinated and developed through the City's Department of Children, Youth and Their Families and the San Francisco Unified School District's Career Technical Education department - in all future business and event negotiations.
