WHEREAS, Filipino Americans should be recognized for their strong commitment to

family and community, their valuable contributions in the workplace, and their role in fighting for equality for all Americans, particularly immigrant and minority communities; and,

WHEREAS, The Filipino American community is the second largest Asian American group in the United States, and California, especially San Francisco and the Bay Area, home to the greatest number of Filipino Americans; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors joins local residents, our Bay Area neighbors, and all Americans whose lives have been enriched by the beautiful culture and strength of Filipino Americans; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors stands with all Filipino Americans commemorating their history of shaping and strengthening our nation and their many contributions; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That San Francisco will continue to pursue and prioritize policies that recognize the needs and values of Filipino Americans and show appreciation for their communities; and be it
