[Donation of Obsolete Ambulance to City College of San Francisco]

WHEREAS, City College of San Francisco is a leading educational institution for Emergency Medical Services Program and teaches those who wish to be future Emergency Medical Technicians and Paramedics; and

WHEREAS, A large part of Emergency Medical Services training is concerned with manipulative skills and the best way to learn those skills is to practice on actual equipment; and

WHEREAS, Emergency Medical Services equipment is expensive and difficult to obtain and the San Francisco Fire Department wishes to donate a retired vehicle for educational training purposes; and

WHEREAS, Vehicle 145-761, a Ford Ambulance, has been retired from service even as a relief piece; and

WHEREAS, Ambulance 145-761 would serve as a teaching tool for patient assessment, loading and treatment and City College would benefit from an actual ambulance on which to train its students; and

WHEREAS, On August 8, 2013, the Fire Commission adopted Resolution 2013-02, Recommending that the Board of Supervisors Approve the Donation of an Obsolete Ambulance to the Fire Sciences Program at City College of San Francisco; and

WHERAS. The Fire Commission Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 140697, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 21 of the Municipal Code allows for commodities that have been declared as surplus to be disposed of in a manner that will best serve the interests of the City and will maximize the City's economic return on the surplus commodities by donating to public entities, non-profit organizations and schools; and,

WHEREAS, Among the first criteria on the priority list for donation of surplus commodities are schools that are physically located in San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, City College is an institution of learning (school) and is physically located in San Francisco, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Fire Department wishes to donate Ambulance 145-761 to the Emergency Medical Services Academy of the City College of San Francisco.
