Resolution urging the successful resolution of negotiations between the San Francisco Unified School District and the United Educators of San Francisco to avoid a strike and an interruption to the education of San Francisco's students

[Urging the Successful Resolution of Negotiations between the San Francisco Unified School

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors recognizes that the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD), an independent public agency governed by an elected sevenmember Board of Education and the United Educators of San Francisco (UESF), the collective voice of 5,363 SFUSD teachers and paraprofessionals are the sole entities authorized to negotiate the salaries and contracts of SFUSD teachers and paraprofessionals; and

WHEREAS, SFUSD and UESF are both committed to fair and equitable compensation for teachers and paraprofessionals serving SFUSD students, and in exploring all avenues to reach a common agreement that is fiscally responsible; and

WHEREAS, the state of California's spending on public education does not remotely match the cost of living in San Francisco, which constrains the ability of the district to compensate well-deserving employees and educators from being able to afford to live in San Francisco; and California has consistently ranked among the lowest states in per-pupil spending despite its high cost of living;

WHEREAS, The passage of Proposition 30 in 2012 and the Local Control Funding Formula, California's new funding formula for K-12 schools, improved the SFUSD's financial standing, but also called for additional services to be provided to low-income, English learners, and foster youth students; and

WHEREAS, The number of SFUSD teachers and paraprofessionals able to afford to live in the City is decreasing; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors is committed to working with SFUSD and educators to support the development of affordable housing in San Francisco; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco Unified School

District and the United Educators of San Francisco to quickly seek common ground for the successful resolution of negotiations and to reach a fair agreement in the best interests of San Francisco's children and youth.
