[National Mental Health Awareness Month - May]

Resolution recognizing and supporting efforts to bring more resources to mental health services locally and declaring May as National Mental Health Awareness Month in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, One in every five adults in the United States experience mental illness; and

WHEREAS, Nearly 26% of homeless adults staying in shelters live with a serious mental illness and an estimated 46% live with severe mental illness and/or substance use disorders; and

WHEREAS, Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States and the 3rd leading cause of death in youth ages 10-24; and

WHEREAS, Nearly ninety-percent of those who died of suicide have an underlying mental illness; and

WHEREAS, Children and youth are adversely affected by mental illness with one in

five, between the ages of 13-18, who have or will have a serious mental illness; and

WHEREAS, Mental health is preventable and treatable with early care and intervention; and

WHEREAS, There is still a prevalent stigma associated with mental health that makes it difficult for those affected to seek help; and

WHEREAS, The economic burden of mental illness costs the United States \$193,200,000,000 in lost earnings per year; and

WHEREAS, Mental health is often less prioritized and less accessible in health care systems; and

Supervisors Yee, Mar BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, African Americans and Latinos access mental health services at about one-half the rate of Caucasian Americans and Asian Americans at about one-third the rate; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco has many dedicated community-based providers that offer culturally competent and bilingual resources to serve at-risk communities of color; and

WHEREAS, Raising awareness about mental health and removing the stigma encourages a safe environment for people to seek treatment; and

WHEREAS, President Barack Obama proclaimed May National Mental Health Awareness Month in 2013 to bring nationwide attention to this significant issue; and now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors recognizes the efforts to bring awareness to mental health and to commit more resources to accessible services; and, be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That the month of May be known and recognized as National Mental Health Awareness Month in the City and County of San Francisco.
