19	San Francisco Superior Court, Case No. CGC-19-576554, by the payment of \$280,000 and		
20	an agreement by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency ("SFMTA") to waive		
21	\$50,000 in fees owed by Bay Area Motivate, LLC ("Motivate"), along with the SFMTA's		
22	agreement to acknowledge Motivate's contractual exclusivity while retaining the ability to		
23	utilize a second bike share operator in certain enumerated circumstances, and other		
24	programmatic and operational terms regarding the Bay Area Bike Share Program in San		
25	Francisco. The lawsuit involves the interpretation of a grant of exclusive rights to Motivate in
