- 25 Section 1. Declaration of Emergency Pursuant to Charter Section 2.107.

(a) Section 2.107 of the Charter authorizes passage of an emergency ordinance in
cases of public emergency affecting life, health, or property, or for the uninterrupted operation
of any City or County department or office required to comply with time limitations established
by law. An emergency ordinance enacted under Charter Section 2.107 automatically
terminates on the 61st day after passage, but may be reenacted upon the same terms and
conditions applicable to its initial enactment.

7 (b) Pursuant to Charter Section 2.107, the City enacted Ordinance No. 84-20, an 8 emergency ordinance, which temporarily established protections for occupants of residential 9 hotels ("SRO Residents") during the COVID-19 pandemic. The emergency ordinance became 10 effective when enacted, on May 29, 2020. On September 11, 2020, Ord. No. 84-20 was reenacted by another emergency ordinance, Ord. No. 161-20, and amended to address the 11 12 City's duty to post information in residential hotels concerning the rights of residents to access 13 services related to COVID-19. Ord. No. 161-20 will terminate automatically on November 11, 14 2020, unless reenacted.

(c) The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the findings declared in Section 1 of
Ordinance No. 84-20 and reaffirmed in Section 1 of Ord. No. 161-20 remain valid and
compelling, and declares further that an actual emergency continues to exist that requires the
reenactment of Ordinance No. 84-20, as amended by Ord. No. 161-20, to reduce the spread
of COVID-19. COVID-19 continues to present an extremely dangerous public health risk to
the residents of residential hotels and to individuals who work in residential hotels.

Section 2. Reenactment of Emergency Ordinance. Consistent with Charter Section
 2.107, this emergency ordinance reenacts for an additional 60 days the emergency ordinance
 providing temporary protections to occupants of residential hotels (Ordinance No. 84-20), as
 amended by Ord. No. 161-20-, and amends Section 3 of said emergency ordinance to read as

12	medical information:

14	(5) As soon as feasible but not more than 12 hours after receiving such
15	confirmation, prominently post in common areas of the Residential Hotel where fire safety
16	information is required to be posted a notice to advise SRO Residents that a COVID-19 case
17	has been identified in the building, and of their rights under this emergency ordinance to
18	access I/Q Hotel Rooms, COVID-19 testing, and face coverings. Such notice shall include,
19	but not be limited to, the number of the language-accessible COVID-19 telephone hotline for
20	SRO Residents that residents may call to access these resources.
21	* * * *

23	Section 3. Effective Date; Retroactivity; Expiration.
24	This reenacted emergency ordinance shall become effective immediately upon
25	enactment, shall have operative effect retroactively to the date that Ord. 161-20 expired, and

1	shall expire on the 61st day following the date that Ord. 161-20 expired<u>effective date</u>, unless
2	reenacted as provided by Charter Section 2.107. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs
3	the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance
4	within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the
5	ordinance.
6	
7	Section 4. Directions to Clerk. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is hereby directed
8	to place a copy of this reenacted emergency ordinance in File No. 200456 for Ordinance No.
9	84-20 and File No. 200762 for Ord. No. 161-20, and to make a notation cross-referencing this
10	emergency ordinance where Ordinance Nos. 84-20 and 161-20 appear on the Board of
11	Supervisors website as legislation passed.

13	Section 5. Supermajority Vote Required. In accordance with Charter Section 2.107,

14 passage of this reenacted emergency ordinance by the Board of Supervisors requires an

15 affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board of Supervisors.
