[Supporting California State Assembly Bill No. 1605 (Ting, Bloom) - City and County of San Francisco: Crooked Street Reservation and Pricing Program]

Resolution supporting California State Assembly Bill No. 1605, authored by Assembly Members Phil Ting and Richard Bloom, authorizing the City and County of San Francisco by ordinance to conduct a reservation and pricing program for vehicles that use the "Crooked Street" on Lombard Street between Leavenworth Street and Hyde Street.

WHEREAS, Every year, over two million people visit the 1000 block of Lombard Street, commonly known as the "Crooked Street," creating safety and quality of life challenges for residents and the surrounding community; and

WHEREAS, On a busy day, the vehicle queue will back up over three blocks west past the intersection of Lombard Street and Van Ness Avenue, causing severe congestion, poor air quality, and safety concerns; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has implemented several vehicle and pedestrian management policies, including the Lombard Ambassadors, Parking Control Officers to direct traffic, increased police enforcement, and traffic flow re-engineering, but significant and pervasive vehicle queuing remains a challenge; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco County Transportation Authority led a study in 2017 on managing access to the Crooked Street and found a Reservation and Pricing System would be the most effective method to manage vehicular access and traffic congestion; and

WHEREAS, After extensive community outreach, residents and neighborhood organizations have expressed a need to address congestion around the Crooked Street and support the Reservation and Pricing System; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisor of the City and County of San Francisco supports California State Assembly Bill No. 1605 for the reasons stated herein; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit copies of this Resolution to the State Legislature and the City Lobbyist upon passage.
