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3 **Resolution appointing Toby Eastman, Patricia Scott, Patricia Nelson Doyle, Connie R.**
4 **Davis, Karey Fenderson, Joanna Uribe, Crystal Baik, Michele Byrnes, Maria Ramiu,**
5 **Leona Cannon-Hunter, Lanette Scott and Bill Bettencourt, terms ending August 31,**
6 **2007, to the Foster Care Improvement Task Force, residency requirement waived.**

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8 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
9 does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Foster
10 Care Improvement Task Force, pursuant to the provisions of the San Francisco Administrative
11 Code, Sections 5.300, and 5.305 as well as Ordinance No. 279-05; for the term specified:

12 Toby Eastman (residency requirement waived), new appointment, seat 3, must be a
13 representative of a neighborhood organization from South of Market/Tenderloin, for the
14 unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007.

15 Patricia Scott, new appointment, seat 5, must be a representative of a neighborhood
16 organization from Western Addition, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending
17 August 31, 2007.

18 Patricia Nelson Doyle (residency requirement waived), new appointment, seat 6, must
19 be a representative of a neighborhood organization from Bayview/Hunter's Point, for the
20 unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007.

21 Connie R. Davis, new appointment, seat 7, must be a representative of a faith-based
22 organization, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007.

23 Karey Fenderson, new appointment, seat 8, must be a representative of a childcare
24 organization, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007.

1 Joanna Uribe (residency requirement waived), new appointment, seat 9, must be
2 involved in engagement and community planning, with expertise working with African-
3 American and Latino families, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31,
4 2007.

5 Crystal Baik, new appointment, seat 10, must be a representative from a domestic
6 violence organization, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007.

7 Michele Byrnes (residency requirement waived), new appointment, seat 11, must be a
8 representative from an organization dedicated to serving emancipated youth, for the
9 unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007.

10 Maria Ramiu, new appointment, seat 12, must be a representative of a foster care
11 advocacy organization, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007.

12 Leona Cannon-Hunter, new appointment, seat 13, must be a foster care parent, for the
13 unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007.

14 Lanette Scott, new appointment, seat 14, must be an emancipated youth, for the
15 unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007.

16 Bill Bettencourt, new appointment, seat 15, must be a representative of a child welfare
17 organization, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending August 31, 2007; and, be it

18 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 19 1. The membership of the Foster Care Improvement Task Force has a goal to be
20 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- 21 2. Applicants Toby Eastman, Patricia Nelson Doyle, Joanna Uribe and Michele Byrnes, new
22 appointees, who are not residents of San Francisco, are persons with experience that
23 uniquely qualifies them to serve on the Foster Care Improvement Task Force.
- 24 3. The Foster Care Improvement Task Force has attempted to fill the positions, for which
25 Toby Eastman, Patricia Nelson Doyle, Joanna Uribe and Michele Byrnes were nominated,

- 1 3. The Foster Care Improvement Task Force has attempted to fill the positions, for which
2 Toby Eastman, Patricia Nelson Doyle, Joanna Uribe and Michele Byrnes were nominated,
3 with individuals who are City residents and who have the specific experience, skills, and
4 qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has
5 certified that Toby Eastman, Patricia Nelson Doyle, Joanna Uribe and Michele Byrnes are
6 qualified to serve on the Foster Care Improvement Task Force.
- 7 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there are no other
8 possible representatives, who are residents of San Francisco and who have the specific
9 experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by these applicants, and who are willing to
10 serve on the Foster Care Improvement Task Force at this time; and, be it

11 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency
12 requirement for Toby Eastman, Patricia Nelson Doyle, Joanna Uribe and Michele Byrnes, as
13 allowed in cases where no qualified City residents, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to
14 Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions,
15 and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be
16 resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
