2 - Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Program - \$69,818]

3 **Resolution retroactively authorizing the Police Department to accept and expend a**
4 **grant in the amount of \$69,818 from the California Governor's Office of Emergency**
5 **Services for the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Program to train and**
6 **procure equipment for the Criminology Laboratory with the project period beginning on**
7 **April 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023.**

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9 WHEREAS, The Administrative Code requires City departments to obtain Board of
10 Supervisors' approval to accept or expend any grant funds; and

11 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors provided in the administrative provisions of the
12 Fiscal Year (FY) 2021-2022 Annual Appropriation Ordinance that approval of recurring grant
13 funds contained in departmental budget submissions and approved in the FY2021-2022
14 budget are deemed to meet the requirements of the Administrative Code regarding grant
15 approvals; and

16 WHEREAS, The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services that provides
17 grant funds to the Police Department requires documentation of the Board's approval of their
18 specific grant funds (Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Program Grant); and

19 WHEREAS, The Police Department (SFPD) applied for funding from the California
20 Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) for the Criminology Laboratory; and

21 WHEREAS, On June 3, 2022, the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services
22 (Cal OES) approved SFPD's application in the amount of \$69,818 to pay for training and
23 procure equipment for the Criminology Laboratory for the project period beginning on April 1,
24 2022, through June 30, 2023; and

25 WHEREAS, The adopted budget for FY2021-2022 is \$61,437; and

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WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance Amendment; and
WHEREAS, The SFPD proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors retroactively authorizes SFPD to accept and expend the grant of \$69,818 from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES); and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Chief of Police, or his designee, to enter into the agreement on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, as well as execute extensions and amendments for this grant.
