Resolution authorizing the Department of the Environment ("Environment Department") to accept and expend a grant award of \$14,996,876 for an anticipated term of up to eight years beginning in the first half of calendar year 2025, from the United States Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration for the development and deployment of up to 300 electric vehicle charging stations in San Francisco, for related outreach and education, and for evaluation of the project as submitted in the application, entitled "Boosting Charging by 30% for San Francisco Residents"; and delegating authority under Charter, Section 9.118(a), to the Director of the San Francisco Environment Department to approve a grant agreement between the City, acting by and through the Environment Department, and the Department of Transportation, for an anticipated term of up to eight years beginning in the first half of calendar year 2025, from February 1, 2025, through January 31, 2032, and for a total not to exceed amount of \$14,996,876.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is a long-standing leader in local and regional vehicle electrification program development and implementation; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco Environment Code Chapter 9 established a goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions from within San Francisco by at least 61% by 2030 compared to 1990 levels, and achieving net zero emissions by 2040; and

WHEREAS, In 2022, the transportation sector remains the largest sector-based source of greenhouse gas emissions in San Francisco, accounting for 45% of citywide emissions; and

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WHEREAS, The City has a goal to achieve 1,760 publicly accessible EV charging ports in San Francisco to serve EV demand in 2030; and

WHEREAS, On May 30, 2024, the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) requested proposals for funding under the Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Discretionary Grant Program established under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act to strategically deploy publicly accessible electric vehicle charging and other alternative fueling infrastructure in urban and rural communities in publicly accessible locations, including downtown areas and local neighborhoods, particularly in underserved and disadvantaged communities; and

WHEREAS, The Environment Department on September 11, 2024, submitted its application titled, "Boosting Charging by 30% for San Francisco Residents;" and

WHEREAS, The project aims to provide up to 270 Level 2 and 30 DC Fast Charging ports in publicly accessible garages and lots and at curbside locations in and adjacent to Justice40 disadvantaged communities, particularly those with multi-family housing and limited access to off-street parking, in collaboration with the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency, The Port of San Francisco, and the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission; and

WHEREAS, The grant application to the DOT FHWA included EVgo Services and Connected Kerb, which were competitively selected before the grant application was submitted, as co-applicants; and

WHEREAS, On January 6, 2025, U.S. Senator Alex Padilla issued a notice that the San Francisco Environment Department was selected to receive \$15 million in funding under the FHWA CFI Grant Program to install up to 300 EV charging ports in publicly accessible garages, lots, and curbside locations, primarily serving disadvantaged and other underserved communities; and

WHEREAS, Additional subgrantees and/or contractors to execute grant activities such as community engagement and program evaluation will be competitively selected during the grant term; and

WHEREAS, The term of the grant is anticipated to be up to eight years, beginning in the first half of calendar year 2025; and

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Transportation award required the project provide matching support of \$3,749,219; and

WHEREAS, EVgo Services and Connected Kerb have agreed that, together, they will cover the full amount of the required matching support; and

WHEREAS, Charter, Section 9.118(a), requires Board of Supervisors' approval by Resolution of any contract that when entered into has anticipated revenue of \$1 million dollars or more; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an amendment to the Annual Salary Ordinance: and

WHEREAS, Administrative Code, Section 2.6-3, requires the Budget Analyst to review legislation and report on matters that are deemed to have fiscal impact and on January 10, 2025, the Budget and Legislative Analyst determined this matter has fiscal impact and requires a fiscal impact report be submitted prior to the legislation being heard in a fiscal committee; and

WHEREAS, The following accompanying documents are required in a Accept and Expend package submitted to the Board of Supervisors to be placed on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 250030: 1) proposed grant resolution signed by the Department, Mayor, and Controller; 2) grant information form, including a disability checklist; 3) grant budget; 4) grant application; 5) grant award letter from funding agency; 6) ethics form

126 (if applicable); 7) contract and/or, leases (if applicable), or agreements (if applicable); 8) grant agreement; 9) and other forms (if applicable); and

WHEREAS, The Environment Department submits with this Resolution, all of the above-listed required documents that are applicable to this grant, including the grant information form, with the disability checklist, grant budget as proposed in the application, award letter, and grant application; with the exception of the grant agreement, as the agreement are not available at this time and will be submitted for inclusion in the Board File once complete; and

WHEREAS, The grant budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$88,200; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, Due to the lack of a fiscal impact report, as required by Administrative Code, Section 2.6-3, and incomplete documentation in the Accept and Expend submission, the funds accepted for this grant shall be placed into the Board of Supervisors' reserve until the funds are released; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, Once the fiscal impact requirements of Administrative Code, Section 2.6-3 have been resolved and all outstanding documents have been submitted, the Board of Supervisors delegates their authority to release these funds to the Budget and Finance Committee and the Clerk of the Board is directed to schedule a hearing of the Budget and Finance Committee to duly review the complete file and submitted documents and consider the release of the funds to the Environment Department; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of the Environment Department is hereby authorized to accept the United States Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration grant award of \$14,996,876 on behalf of the City, in accordance with the purposes and goals for the funding; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That no new position shall be funded by this grant unless it is approved by a future amendment to the Annual Salary Ordinance by an ordinance containing the classification, duration and number of positions to be funded, and any continuing positions funded by this grant shall be identified, along with each position's authority and funding that was previously approved, prior to the Release of Reserve Hearing to be held at the Budget and Finance Committee and considered with the complete file; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby delegates authority under Charter, Section 9.118(a), to the Director of the Environment Department to execute the grant agreement with the Department of Transportation for use of these grant funds with a total not to exceed amount of \$14,996,876, for a term of up to eight years beginning in the first half of calendar year 2025, for implementation of the program entitled "Boosting Charging by 30% for San Francisco Residents," which includes development and deployment of up to 300 electric vehicle charging stations, related outreach and education, and program development (the "Grant Agreement"), and any amendments to the Grant Agreement; and further delegates authority under Charter, Section 9.118(a), to the Director of the Environment Department to execute agreements with EVgo Services and Connected Kerb, and any amendments thereto, for the use of Grant Agreement funds as necessary to carry out the purposes of the Grant Agreement; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Department of the Environment shall be hereby authorized to expend the United States Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration grant award of \$14,996,876, upon the release of the funds from Board of Supervisors' Reserve.
